Feast Day of St Vincent de Paul - September 27



St. Vincent de Paul was born to a poor peasant family in the French village of Pouy on April 24, 1581. His first formal education was provided by the Franciscans. He did so well, he was hired to tutor the children of a nearby wealthy family. He used the monies he earned teaching to continue his formal studies at the University of Toulouse where he studied theology.

He was ordained in 1600 and remained in Toulouse for a time. In 1605, while on a ship traveling from Marseilles to Narbonne, he was captured, by pirates and brought to Tunis and sold as a slave. Two years later he and his master managed to escape and both returned to France.

St. Vincent went to Avignon and later to Rome to continue his studies. While there he became a chaplain to the Count of Goigny and was placed in charge of distributing money to the deserving poor. He became pastor of a small parish in Clichy for a short period of time, while also serving as a tutor and spiritual director.

From that point forward he spent his life preaching missions to and providing relief to the poor. He even established hospitals for them. This work became his passion. He later extended his concern and ministry to convicts. The need to evangelize and assist these souls was so great and the demands beyond his own ability to meet that he founded the Congregation of Priests of the Mission, commonly referred to now as the Vincentians.

This was at a time when there were not many priests in France and what priests there were, were neither well-formed nor faithful to their way of life. Vincent helped reform the clergy and the manner in which they were instructed and prepared for the priesthood. He did this first through the presentation of retreats and later by helping develop a precursor to our modern day seminaries. At one point his community was directing 53 upper level seminaries. His retreats, open to priests and laymen, were so well attended that it is said he infused a "Christian spirit among more than 20,000 persons in his last 23 years."

The Vincentians remain with us today with nearly 4,000 members in 86 countries. In addition to his order of Vincentian priests, St. Vincent cofounded the Daughters of Charity along with St. Louise de Marillac. There are more than 18,000 Daughters today serving the needs of the poor in 94 countries. He was eighty years old when he died in Paris on September 27, 1660. He had "become the symbol of the successful reform of the French Church". St. Vincent is sometimes referred to as "The Apostle of Charity" and "The Father of the Poor".

Vincent de Paul was canonized in 1737 by Pope Clement xiii after 2 miracles were attributed to his intercession.

Mary's visit offers each family an opportunity to:

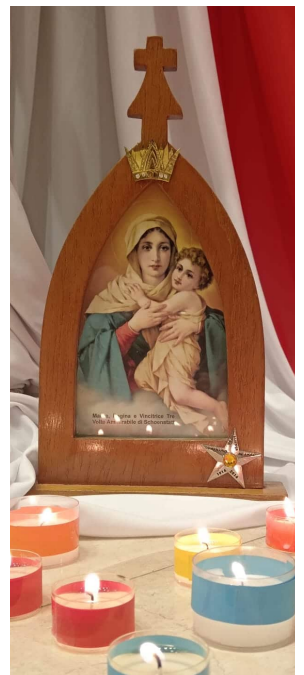
- Deepen their prayer life

Agape comes to us from Ancient Greek meaning "unconditional love", or "the highest form of love or charity" and "the love of God for man and of man for God". Agape Table's Mission is to enhance the lives of those in need by welcoming everyone to our table without judgement or bias. They are committed to providing a community-based program, nourishing the body, mind, and spirit of our guests in a cost-effective and financially responsible manner.

Once again, the St. Timothy Parish Conference of the Society of St Vincent de Paul will be reaching out to our friends at Agape Table to help them in their efforts to feed the poorest of the poor in Winnipeg.

Since Agape Table has moved into their new building, they have made some changes to the way they feed the city's hungry. People are now provided with a meal inside the new facility – hearty soup, toast, pastry, and donated juice boxes, granola bars and fruit and pudding cups.

Sandwich filling is no longer needed.



Due to the overwhelming generosity of our parishioners we are able to purchase the required granola bars, juice boxes, fruit and pudding cups for 500 men women and children.

We are looking for 6-10 volunteers to help SERVE meals at Agape Table, situated at **350 Furby Street** on the morning of **Thursday, October 29th**. Volunteers will serve meals and bus tables (clearing and cleaning the tables). This new process may involve prolonged standing and walking and carrying trays. There are limited positions for sitting. Therefore, we ask that you consider the physical demands of the work before volunteering for Agape Table.
