What Catholics Believe About Mary: Immaculate Conception, Virginity & the Rosary

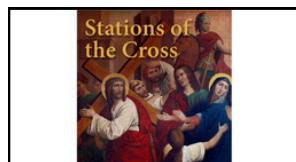

Parish of St. Timothy Sanctuary Renovation

Dear friends,

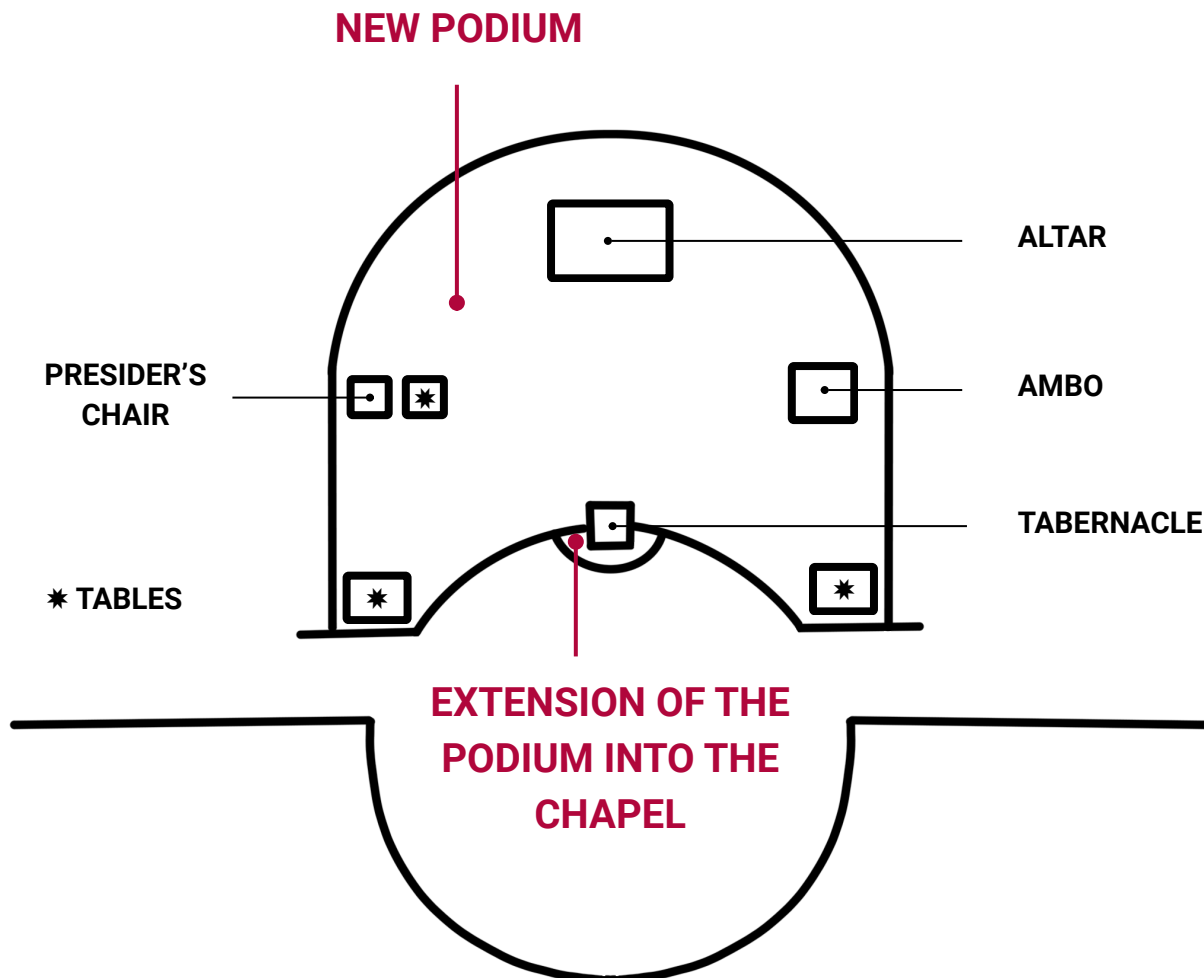
In July 2025, we completed the first phase of the new layout to our church, especially the sanctuary. This fairly easy and no cost change has been quite positively received by visitors and parishioners alike. There is so much benefit from having the tabernacle now located at the back of the sanctuary, behind the altar, while still being close to the chapel which retains its original intent and goodness. This past July, I spoke in a Sunday homily about the second phase: the building of a permanent, singular sanctuary platform to replace the three separate wooden platforms we have currently under the ambo, presider's chair and altar. Now that the three movable platforms are not really needed and have their own issues as well (degradation and safety), the singular fixed platform is the next logical step.

You can see below a drawing of what this would look like conceptually. One of the benefits of having a single platform for the sanctuary is that we would need less space for the sanctuary. My hope was that a smaller sanctuary platform, while still functioning well for the celebration of the liturgy, would allow for more space in the rest of the church where everyone else is. The height will be similar to what we currently have with a single step. Though the platform is a bit different than what we currently have, you can see how the main elements of our sanctuary would be all still set up similar to how they are now, just a bit closer together. There are still a number of practical considerations for us to investigate (timeline, cost, materials, etc.), but now that we have a concept on paper, we can begin discussing those and sharing them with you over time.

It seemed fitting and providential to have this in our bulletin now that we've completed the 82-part "Walk Through the Mass" series. All of these elements of the Mass, the source and summit of our Christian lives, have been broken open for us to reflect upon more deeply and personally. All the rich elements that make up the Mass surround the greatest gift Jesus left the Church: himself, present in the Blessed Sacrament. The sanctuary should remind us of the Holy of Holies, the place where God dwells and perfect sacrifice is offered, which results in a rich banquet for us: the wedding feast of the Lamb.

I hope this generates interest and conversation. Feel free to discuss with me, share thoughts, and ask questions.
